Pursuant to the authority provided under California Government Code Section 68115 and as granted in the June 12, 2020, order of Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the Judicial Council of California,

This Court **HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:**

1. Hold sessions anywhere in the county, including in correctional and juvenile detention facilities, from June 14, 2020, to July 11, 2020, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(1));
2. If the court determines it is necessary, the court may extend the time period provided in section 313 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody

1 pending dependency proceedings must be released from custody to not more than seven (7) days.
2 (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(11).) This order applies only to minors for whom the statutory deadline
3 otherwise would expire from June 14, 2020, to July 11, 2020, inclusive (Gov. Code, §
4 68115(a)(11));
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6 3. If the court determines it is necessary, the court may extend the time period provided in
7 section 315 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody
8 pending dependency proceedings must be given a detention hearing to not more than seven (7)
9 days. (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(11).) This order applies only to minors for whom the statutory
10 deadline otherwise would expire from June 14, 2020, to July 11, 2020, inclusive (Gov. Code, §
11 68115(a)(11));
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13 4. If the court determines it is necessary, the court may extend the time periods provided in
14 sections 632 and 637 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into
15 custody pending wardship proceedings and charged with a felony offense must be given a
16 detention hearing or rehearing to not more than seven (7) days. (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(11).)
17 This order applies only to minors for whom the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from
18 June 14, 2020, to July 11, 2020, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(11));

20 5. If the court determines it is necessary, the court may extend the time period provided in
21 section 334 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a hearing on a juvenile
22 dependency petition must be held by not more than seven (7) days. (Gov. Code, §
23 68115(a)(12).) This order applies only to minors for whom the statutory deadline otherwise
24 would expire from June 14, 2020, to July 11, 2020, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(11));
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26 6. If the court determines it is necessary, the court may extend the time period provided in
27 section 657 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a hearing on a wardship petition
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1 for a minor charged with a felony offense must be held by not more than fifteen (15) days. (Gov.
2 Code, § 68115(a)(12).) This order applies only to minors for whom the statutory deadline
3 otherwise would expire from June 14, 2020, to July 11, 2020, inclusive (Gov. Code, §
4 68115(a)(11));
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6 This order is intended to supplement the statewide orders issued by the Chief Justice of
7 the California Supreme Court and Emergency Rules of Court adopted by Judicial Council of
8 California.
