GENERAL ORDER RE ADOPTION OF STATEWIDE EMERGENCY BAIL SCHEDULE PURSUANT TO EMERGENCY RULE 4

GENERAL ORDER No.: 2020-008

On April 6, 2020, the Judicial Council of California adopted Emergency Rule 4 requiring each superior court to adopt a Statewide Emergency Bail Schedule to provide uniformity in the handling of certain offenses during the state of emergency related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

In compliance with Emergency Rule 4, Stanislaus County Superior Court amends its current countywide bail schedule to adopt the Statewide Emergency Bail Schedule as follows:

I. Mandatory Application

- A. Notwithstanding any prior order of the Court, the bail amounts set forth in this order must be applied:
 - 1. To every accused person arrested and in pretrial custody;
 - 2. To every accused person held in pretrial custody.
- B. Bail must be applied to the persons described above no later 5:00 pm, on April 13, 2020.

II. <u>Emergency Bail Schedule</u>

- A. Bail for all misdemeanor and felony offenses must be set at \$0, with the exception of only the offenses listed below:
 - 1. A serious felony, as defined in Penal Code section 1192.7(c), or a violent felony, as defined in Penal Code section 667.5(c);
 - 2. A felony violation of Penal Code section 69;
 - 3. A violation of Penal Code section 166(c)(1);
 - 4. A violation of Penal Code section 136.1 when punishment is imposed under section 136.1(c);
 - 5. A violation of Penal Code section 262;
 - 6. A violation of Penal Code sections 243(e)(1) or 273.5;
 - 7. A violation of Penal Code section 273.6 if the detained person made threats to kill or harm, has engaged in violence against, or has gone to the residence or workplace of, the protected party;

- 8. A violation of Penal Code section 422 where the offense is punished as a felony;
- 9. A violation of Penal Code section 646.9;
- 10. A violation of an offense listed in Penal Code section 290(c);
- 11. A violation of Vehicle Code sections 23152 or 23153;
- 12. A felony violation of Penal Code section 463; and
- 13. A violation of Penal Code section 29800.
- B. The current countywide bail schedule remains in effect for all offenses listed in exceptions (1) through (13) above, including any count-specific conduct enhancements and any status enhancements.
- C. Nothing in the Emergency Bail Schedule restricts the ability of the court to deny bail as authorized by article I, section 12, or article I, section 28(f)(3) of the California Constitution.

III. Bail for violations of post-conviction supervision

- A. Bail for all violations of misdemeanor probation, whether the arrest is with or without a bench warrant, must be set at \$0.
- B. Bail for all violations of felony probation, parole, post-release community supervision, or mandatory supervision, must be set at \$0, or for the bail amount in the court's countywide schedule of bail for charges of conviction listed in exceptions II. A. (1) through (13) above, including any enhancements.

This order is effective immediately and shall remain in effect until modified or rescinded by order of this court, or until terminated, amended, or repealed by operation of Emergency Rule 4(g).
