18 19	On April 6, 2020, the Judicial Council of California approved Emergency Rule of Court 3 –
20	"use of technology for remote appearances" - which provides, at Rule 3(a)(1) that "courts may
21	
22	require that judicial proceedings and court operations be conducted remotely." Rule 3(a)(3) also
23	provides that "conducting proceedings remotely includes, but is not limited to, the use of
24	telephonic means for remote appearances " Emergency Rule 3 remains in effect until 90
25	days after the Governor declares that the state of emergency related to the COVID-19 pandemic
26	is lifted, or until it is amended or repealed by the Judicial Council.

Given the ongoing COVID-19 public health emergency and based on the authority granted to it in Emergency Rule 3, the Stanislaus County Superior Court ("Court") previously ordered, on September 8, 2021, in General Order No. 2021-017, that all parties and counsel are required to appear remotely for case management conferences, law and motion hearings; and ex parte hearings in Civil cases, unless prior to the hearing the Court grants a request to appear in person or another exception applies.

As recognized by Emergency Rule 3 and the Court's General Order 2021-017, remote appearances have become a critical tool in enabling access to justice during the COVID-19 pandemic. However, parties must pay a telephonic appearance fee to the Court in order to appear remotely. (Cal. Rules of Court, rule 3.670.)

In light of the above facts, the Court HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

 Beginning October 18, 2021, the Court will suspend the fee to remotely appear using VCourt, the Court's remote appearance platform; and

2. The Court will review the need to mandate remote appearances as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic within the next sixty (60) days; and

3. The suspension of the remote appearance fee will expire on December 17, 2021 - unless earlier rescinded, extended or otherwise modified.

This order is intended to supplement the statewide emergency orders issued by the Chief Justice of the California Supreme Court, the Emergency Rules of Court adopted by the Judicial Council of California, and the Court's own local emergency orders. If there is any conflict between the terms of the statewide emergency orders, the Emergency Rules of Court, and the

2	emergency orders shall control.
