## **Requesting a Court Trial**

You have the right to appear in Court for arraignment and trial (contest your case) without deposit of bail, according to California Rules of Court, Rule 4.105.

If you have not already been arraigned or previously waived formal arraignment, which resulted in a conviction, you have the right to appear without a deposit of bail.

If you have already been convicted, your options include:

- 1. Submitting a Request for Order you request is considered on the merits of your paperwork submitted, including documentation you may provide.
- 2. Filing a motion to schedule a hearing date (considered on your paperwork and verbal statements).

If you have not been to an Arraignment hearing, and you now wish to enter a not guilty plea and request a Court Trial to contest your case, you will have two ways of doing this:

- 1. Appear in Court for your arraignment, enter your plea, and request a Court Trial to be scheduled. The Judicial Officer will choose a date and you will be scheduled to return for your Court trial.
- 2. Submit an Advisement of Rights and Plea of Not Guilty in Writing (Traffic Infraction) form.
  - a. Your form will be submitted to the Clerk's Office for processing.
  - b. Is is important to file it as soon as possible.
  - c. Submit your form in person, and the Clerk will set your case for trial (if you are eligible). You will receive a Notice of Court Trial from the clerk with your hearing date and time for you to return for your Court trial.
  - d. If you submit your form by mail, the Clerk will set your case for Trial and send you a Notice of Court Trial.
  - e. The Clerk's Office will notify the appropriate law enforcement agency of the trial date.
